Clip 1—minnows in seagrass, hardbottom community

Clip 2—hogfish in turtle grass, swimming

Clip 3—southern stingray, (shot from boat), swimming

Clip 4a—queen conch in grass, close-up of eyes

Clip 4b—queen conch upside down in grassbed, close-up of foot and mantle tissue

Clip 5—close-up of a pink-tipped anemone in seagrass

Clip 6—mixed seagrass bed, moving through the grass close-up

Clip 7—school of fish over grassbed (mixed species), hardbottom --lots of fish

Clip 8—nurse shark, (shot from boat), swimming

Clip 9—close-up of rose coral in seagrass

Clip 10— manatee grass bed, barracuda swimming away

Clip 11—Turtle grass-- short shoot with rhizomes, leaves, and rootlets

Clip 12—comet sea star, pink-tipped anemone in manatee grass
